OMAFRA, OHA & DISTRICT 10

All Horticultural Societies in Ontario are governed by:

- OMAFRA Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs. By law (Agricultural and Horticultural Organizations Act of Ontario), ALL Horticultural Societies in Ontario fall under the authority of OMAFRA.
- OHA Ontario Horticultural Association (GardenOntario). 270
 Horticultural Societies across Ontario belong to OHA, which is
 divided into 19 Districts.
- **District 10** supports 22 Societies within the Counties of Elgin, Oxford, Middlesex, Perth & into Lambton Shores. The District functions as OHA's liaison and provides support to the Societies in their area.

Ontario

OMAFRA

Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs

- All Horticultural Societies and Agricultural Societies or Associations are governed under OMAFRA (Ontario Ministry of Agricultural, Food and Rural Affairs).
- OMAFRA is funded by the Provincial Government.
- They provide regulations, education, grants to Agricultural Associations and Horticultural Societies in Ontario.
- OMAFRA requires an annual report from societies to be filed <u>by Feb 1, 2021</u>. Please note there has been a delay in having their new forms available. Societies will be notified by email and the due date will be extended.





The OHA is a strong and vibrant organization, divided into 19 Districts, with 270 Horticultural Societies across Ontario.

OHA Organizational Chart







OMAFRA

- \$0 Horticultural Societies do not pay dues to OMAFRA. They are funded by the Ontario Government.
- Horticultural Societies are required to submit an annual report and grant application to receive grants from OMAFRA.



OHA



Your Society's annual dues invoice from the OHA includes:

- \$3 per member affiliation fee for OHA
- .74 cents per member for general and liability insurance
- \$100 flat rate per society for Directors and Officers bonding & liability insurance.

Great value for your \$!





District 10



Your Society's annual dues to the District are

.55 cents X number of members

For example: a Society with 100 members pays \$55 per year to the District



Your report is due February 1st which includes a summary of accomplishments and how the pandemic has impacted your society, actual membership numbers 2020, and volunteer hours for the year previously ended, as well as society contact, executive contact, and program information for the current year. It looks like this...

Includes a summary of Special Events, Activities & Fundraisers 2020; How others can find your Society online; Staying Connected with your members; New year, New ideas, New Ways to Succeed: events / fundraisers/activities being planned for 2021.

Speakers List Form

Speakers List includes a list of speakers you had (or had planned to have): their names, topic, type of presentation, rate, & contact

information.
The District reports are collected & shared within D10 Societies. They are full of info & ideas that might work for your Society.

Why you need one & how it directly affects your Society



How do you get noticed?

Tips to improve your Society's online presence, bring awareness, encourage engagement, attract new members, stay connected & share news.

Online is where you need to be.

SOCIAL MEDIA: Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Youtube

- Images, gifs, infographics get 2.5 times more engagement.
- Don't be afraid to add some humour.
- Sprinkle interactive content among your postings, ie: polls, Q&A, surveys, ask your audience to share gardening stories & photos.
- ❖ Use hashtags in your content: ie: #HappyGardeners. Attracts a younger demographic. How to Create a Hashtag: 12 Steps (with Pictures) wikiHow
- Check social media daily, respond to questions promptly.
- It brings your events, projects, meetings & activities to life and inspires like-minded persons to engage.









Can people find you?



ONLINE PRESENCE – website, Society page on gardenontario.org

- Your website / Society page is your Society's digital home, representing you online 24/7.
- "Do once & done" does not apply. Keep your site current and updated.
- Content must be engaging, effective and purposeful
- Share events & send out invitations to other Societies and the District to join in your events.
- "Explain who you are and what you do" to engage people who may have a similar interest. Where do you meet?
- Provide your Social Media links on your website, and your website address (ie: www.district10gardenontario.org) on social media.
- Have your membership form and brochure online for ease of downloading.

Staying Connected



It's been a challenging time during COVID for all our Societies to remain active and stay connected. Keep your members informed and involved by:

- **Virtual Meetings** with your board and members using online platforms such as Skype, Zoom, Teams, WebEx.
- **Find Speakers** who will demonstrate flower arranging or engaging topics virtually. Many speakers have switched to online presentations.
- **Invite other Societies** and the District Board to your online meetings. Advertise to your local community to join in.
- Online fundraisers online auctions, plant sales, etc.
- **Email** share information, quizzes, surveys, etc.
- Telephone Set up a phone committee to help members feel connected & in touch, especially those without online capabilities.

Finding New Board Members

Some ideas:

- •A special meeting could be called. Make a plea to your members as well as the community. WE NEED YOUR HELP! by email, phone, newspaper & social media.
- •Approach people with the skills needed, urge them to make a difference to their community & lead the Society into the future. Set up a recruitment committee.
- •Setting term limits will entice people more readily to join the board & helps to prevent burnout.
- Ask that someone fill in as interim
- •Split job responsibilities, or combine positions (ie Sec-Treas)
- •Consider offering an honorarium for the position.
- •Youth recruitment (must be 18 or older to serve on the board) volunteer hours, tech support, social media. Ask at the local high school for recruits, ask your children/grandchildren.
- **Work as a team**. Take the time to let new people know what is needed & expected. Keep your board informed and involved.
- **Voice your praise** frequently to your volunteers & board members to let them know they are valued and appreciated.
