Floral Presentation:

Cathy Groulx (Woodstock) introduced Rose Odell who created several inspiring and beautiful designs live using materials such as banana leaves, grapes, kiwis, italian ruscus, and kale.

Dubois Presentation:

Gary Hendin (Parkhill) presented a new collaboration with Dubois under a two year agreement with OHA allowing for members to get 10% discount from anything purchased from [Dubois](#). The agreement allows for 2% rebate to local society (quarterly payments) and 2% OHA rebate (quarterly payments) for all purchases. Cards are available for societies to distribute to their members. Monogrammed aprons are also available, which can be sold direct to societies only, in groups of 50. Two sizes are available mid-size for \$14 and full size for \$25 each.

Flower Show Results:

District 10 AGM Flower Show Report Submitted by District 10 Flower Show Convenor Bernice Barratt:

“New Growth from Old Roots” was the theme chosen by Woodstock, the hosting society. The Youth and Photography class titles were chosen from the OHA competitions schedules and the design titles were based on our District theme for 2024.

After reviewing the information collected from the clerking sheets, there were several corrections from the verbal report made at the AGM meeting. They are as follows:

Participation in our 2024 AGM flower show competition came from 14 of the 20 societies. There were a total of 78 exhibits in the Horticultural Division, 36 in the Design Division, 19 in Photography, and 12 Special Exhibits, which was a new division for the show. This came to a grand total of 145 exhibits and all together they made a wonderful display. Congratulations to all who participated!

Julie Riddell (Kirkton) was the judge and she was assisted by Nancy Habermehl from St Marys, Sarah Donovan, and Janet Scott both from Woodstock. The team had to work quickly to sub-divide several horticultural classes. Unfortunately, we also had to carefully move several designs to accommodate the large numbers of entries. The team tried out a new recording/charting system to tabulate the number of

entries per society. It worked well and it was also easier to track which societies are participating in the flower show.
